After all, we wish your students to feel comfortable in their courses and to study successfully at JGU. When applying to JGU, your students need to indicate their language proficiency in the online application form for German Studies and to upload a confirmation for it. They don't need an official language test to prove their knowledge. A statement by the coordinator/a university teacher from the home university that they study German Studies and/or have advanced B1 or preferably B2 level is sufficient to get admitted.
